1. In all states, college support may be voluntarily agreed by the parties, in which case it is contractually enforceable thereafter.
2. Every state provides for some kind of offset, either by formula or deviation. D = deviation, O = offset.
3. Credit given for actual cost of health care insurance premium paid for children.
4. Support may be increased or decreased if the obligor spends more or less than 80 days (the putative normal amount of time) with a child.
